

going to have an impact that was not going to be readily accepted but we did our job as painful as it was and have submitted it to you. But I want to also mention that we are back on a proper course which I am proud to be a part of and do it properly instead of improperly. I think we have changed our process here now that is the way it should be done, and whatever comes out, we will have to accept. I want to say that Senator Johnson is correct. We did have a study done a couple of years ago that showed some very fascinating and enlightening figures and did show that state government was not the big growth factor but that local governments far outshaded but we encouraged that with our increase in state aid under the guise of helping property tax. I can tell you that there are instances right now, and Senator Johnson referred to the reserves, there are instances right now where those reserves have been used to some degree, some of them to the point where they don't have all that much left to fall back on, that further cuts is going to be a problem for them, and they are going to have to hurry and scurry which maybe is not all that bad but it is a factor that is going to happen too. There is going to be gnashing of teeth but there has already been gnashing of teeth, and perhaps, perhaps the recommendation that is being made at this time is the way to go. It was not the way that the committee decided but that is the prerogative of this body and I commend you for doing it properly and up front and right regardless of what the outcome is. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
