

question, if I may. If this whole package is voted on and every proposed cut is adopted, the total amount at the end based on this sheet will be how much altogether? Nineteen million something?

SENATOR WARNER: Right. Almost 19,900.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And after that is done then we adjourn sine die and the problem that the state faced is taken care of. Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: No. Senator Chambers, you could take the position that that 19 million would eliminate the projected revenue shortfall of 16 plus million that would have occurred on...that will occur on June 30th of 1986. But that provides nothing for reserve. It provides nothing for the deficiencies and assumes 100 percent accuracy on projections.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what will be done about that other? After this paper is adopted as it seems it will be, what remains to be done to take care of the rest of the problem?

SENATOR WARNER: Revenue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And where is...based on what is within the call, what revenue bills are available?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, none of them...only one of them are dead or have been indefinitely postponed, Senator Chambers, as a factual matter. You know, my personal position and that of the...I think reflects of the committee based upon the reserve that we think is necessary, we believe there should be \$29 million of additional revenue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how is that to be raised through the bills that the Attorney General ruled would be within the call? Which bills will allow that kind of money to be raised?

SENATOR WARNER: None.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what are we doing then? I just want some things in the record.
