SENATOR MARSH: Thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and what are we going to do about it? That is why I am voting against all these cuts. That is not the way to handle the problem, but I don't think I am going to stay here long enough to vote for every one of them that comes up this evening.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Higgins. You are the last one. We are now ready to vote and we will vote on the State Treasurer's Office. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Twenty-five votes are needed. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of the amendments as they relate to the State Treasurer's office, Madam President.

SENATOR MARSH: The amendment is adopted. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, subject to any announcements that the Clerk has, or Senator Beutler would have relative to tomorrow, I will in a moment move to adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock, if that is acceptable to Senator Beutler. But I do want to indicate that in the morning I will offer a single amendment to adopt all of the committee recommendations, unless someone has indicated that they wish that particular agency discussed specifically, and we will continue with the agencies identified for a specific by their numerical order then.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Clerk.
