

the Falls, and they are trying to figure out a way to try to get to the bank. And I think it is the responsibility of us as a society to try to provide them the tools to figure out how they can reach those banks. That is what that resolution speaks to. Now the last therefore, the last therefore encourages the State Department of Agriculture to continue to coordinate the efforts of all branches of state government and to use all means at their disposal to help the state and all its citizens to meet the challenges of the next few months. That is where I think the Department of Agriculture can play a key role. I don't know whether any of you have ever tried to get the University Extension Service to work with the tech schools or not, or whether you, and I will put it even more bluntly, whether any of you have ever got the University of Nebraska to work with anybody else or not, but if you have, you know you have got an insurmountable task, almost, on your hands. Now I will have to, at the same time I say that, tell you that they are working together right now.

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR VICKERS: I am proud of the fact that they are working together right now, and one of the reasons they are is because Chuck Schroeder has agreed to serve as a coordinating agency to see to it that everybody is working together during this time of crisis to make sure that some things happen, that the access to these kinds of programs are out there. That is the reason I am asking for you to retain these \$50,000. And I also will tell you, if you are one of those people who believe that the Appropriations Committee knows all and that the departments can make adjustments, then, fine, defeat the amendment but, nevertheless, there is going to be another amendment up there, as I told you a little earlier, taking the funds out from another section because I don't happen to think that is true but I also want to make it revenue neutral if possible. I urge you to adopt this amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, then Senator Lundy.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, again I am going to speak a word in behalf of those people described as agricultural. What the Legislature should try to do, and it is probably difficult,
