SENATOR SCHMIT: ...because you are not going to do it. You take one step at a time. This is a small step. It is totally inadequate but it is a small step, and unless you take that one, don't go back home to your people and say we are going to do something substantial because you haven't got the backbone. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, then Senator Vickers

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this discussion of duplication is very interesting to me. It would be like saying there is a hospital in Omaha so you don't need one in Lincoln or any place else because they are going to provide the same services. It is like saying if you go to the University and they have a Liberal Arts College and they have one classroom in which English is taught, you don't have any other classrooms in which it is taught because that is duplication. What Senator Vickers was trying to point out is that for the number of people who have need of this kind of information, this program is helpful. Duplication can be understood in different ways, Senator Lundy. Duplication could be taken to mean if you have more than one of a single item, that is duplication. That is not what we are talking about. We are talking about giving to people some assistance that may not solve all their problems, but we have got to start doing those things which are available for us to do. Now I was sitting here thinking about what we were talking about when Commonwealth was up here before us and a lot of people were talking about the damage done to the minds and the spirit of the people who had lost their money and had been tricked and deceived by the state and other stronger statements than that being made.
