

to reach them because I think the next six months is critical. The next three months is critical. How do you reach these people? I decided the tech schools are out there, too, and the tech schools work with the public schools, and as I indicated, the vocational agricultural instructors are beginning to be trained to help provide this service, and then I am worried about the duplication. Now I don't care about the duplication because I think it is all going to be filled. I think there is going to be needs for a lot more if we can put them out there, and if the word was out there that it is available to them. How do you control it? How do you make sure and coordinate it, make sure it is all happening together? That is when I went to the Department of Agriculture and I said to Chuck Schroeder, Chuck, would you take on the responsibility of trying to oversee this and making sure that it happens together. Get the University to work together along with the tech schools and the voc-ag instructors and that is when I suggested to Chuck that as a coordinating agency you are going to have to have some funds to do it. Now I know Chuck Schroeder said that the funds go on over there to the University. I realize that. But how, if you are the Department of Agriculture Director, Senator Lundy, and you go to the University of Nebraska and you don't have any clubs at all, how are you going to get them to work together, if they don't want to do it? One of the ways to do it is to say, you know, I have got some funds over here and I want to transfer them over to you, and maybe I won't transfer them if you don't work. Maybe I won't transfer them if you don't work. Now that works. The Appropriations Committee uses it all the time. We use it all the time. I am not going to take that tool away from him. I am not going to take that tool away from him. I think the need is out there. The need is out there, every individual that needs this service had ought to have it available to them if possible. Now I can't imagine calling that duplication. I can't imagine, as Senator Chambers indicated, saying that because each hospital is similar to the Omaha hospital, we ought not to have so many hospitals in this state. We ought to only have one because we might duplicate something. There is nothing wrong with duplication if it is needed, and God knows this program is going to be needed because the fact is there is a lot of people out there that are struggling in their own minds trying to figure out how we are going to try to get ourselves out of this situation.
