SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, let me in closing remind those of you that might not have been here that this is a budget cut. This is not adding more money back into the budget. We are taking \$74,000 out of the budget so it is a little different than some of the other amendments that we might have had this morning. Let me also tell you it is not my intention, it is not my intention to interfere with the need for information for our ag land valuation procedure, and if we do learn between now and Select File or whenever if this amendment is adopted, and I haven't got the information, I don't know, maybe others of you know exactly, but I cannot seem to find out exactly how much of that information they are going to collect for the ASCS Office broken down on a county basis, I don't really know. And I don't know how much they can do with 39,000 that would be left to them, but let me assure Senator Landis and others who are interested in that, that that is not my intention
