CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Cal Carsten, please.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Move for the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? All those in favor of the adoption of the amendment vote aye, opposed nay. I should really say sections though. Have you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Section 14 of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Section 14 is adopted. And we have finished number 16? We did, didn't we?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: And we're on to Section 21 which is Institutions.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, Section 21 of the committee amendments relates to the Department of Public Institutions.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to speak about the Institutions?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this agency will be...could be a little different and I would like to explain, at least two options and there obviously could be others. This is one of the agencies where the committee's recommendation is a deeper cut, higher cut than would be in the Governor's bill, so one of those cases if you think our recommended reduction is too much, why you can vote against the committee amendment and then you will have in place the recommended reduction in the Governor's budget. I think it is probably best if I just described to you the differences between the two, which you could then make your decision. The Governor's budget has a total of 552,000 of reduction in the operations of the Department of Institutions. And that amount of money is
