SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you want to say something? No, I didn't ask if you wanted to debate the question. You didn't have anything to say? All right. The question is, shall we adjourn? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. A voice vote has been asked for, so...excuse me. Pardon me, a machine vote has been asked for, so we will vote by machine and we're voting on adjournment. Senator Hall. Okay. A simple majority, that's right.

SENATOR HALL: Ask for a call of the house.
