This building has been designated to be listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is now as mentioned in the resolution housing a museum, the Museum of the High Plains, in McCook, Nebraska. There has been a long history of good public use of this building and it is a beautiful building and I think that it is appropriate that this Legislature recognize the fact that we do have another listing as far as the Register of Historic Places and Buildings within the State of Nebraska and would urge the adoption of this amendment. I am sure that Senator Harris has some remarks to make concerning this building as a native of McCook and I know his mother has been very active in the museum there. Thank you, Mr. President.

As a native of McCook and with a family and particularly a mother that was very involved in historical society activities, I was engaged in the moving of the what is now known as the High Plains Historical Society, about once every two or three months because we would move from empty building to empty building.
