SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Chronister. Senator Lamb. Senator Rupp. Who else is on the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senators Vickers, Rod Johnson, Morehead.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Rod Johnson. Okay, I understand from the sponsors they wish to hold the amendment until Select File. Are there any other amendments, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Wesely. The motion is withdrawn. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further on this section, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Chambers on the main motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, as with the others, I oppose this one too. Probably if I had the numbers in this body to assure that some changes could occur at a later date, I might or even probably would do as others do and say, well, I will wait until another day to join the battle.
