SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I move to cease debate.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. All those in favor say aye. Opposed. Debate is ceased. Senator Chambers, do you wish to waive closing still? Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Chambers amendment which has the effect of striking Section 38 of the bill dealing with the University of Nebraska. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call taken. See page 93 of the Legislative Journal.) 9 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The amendment fails. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk? There are no further amendments. Is there any further discussion on the bill? Seeing no lights, Senator Warner, would you care to close on the advancement of the bill? Okay, the motion before the body is the advancement of LB 1 to E & R Initial. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call taken. See page 94 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 36 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The bill advances. Do you have any further matters to read in before we adjourn, Mr. Clerk?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Yes, I do, Mr. President. First of all, LR 9 introduced by Senator DeCamp. (Read. See pages 94-95 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over.
