

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please return to your desks and record your presence. All those not in the Chamber please return and record your presence promptly so that we can continue with the voting. Many of you are here who have not recorded your presence, will you please do so. Thank you. Senator Beutler, Senator Chronister, Senator Chambers, Senator Withem and Senator Vickers. Senator Withem, please. Thank you. I think we are looking for Senator Vickers. Did you ask for a roll call vote? All right, we are voting on the Chambers amendment to the Marsh amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Roll call vote has been asked for. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 103 of the Legislative Journal.) 3 ayes, 40 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion to the Marsh amendment fails. We are back to the Marsh amendment. Do you have any other amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Not to that.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Marsh, would you like to close.

SENATOR MARSH: I didn't know I was closing, but I would like to speak.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, excuse me a moment. We'll clear the board. I don't have any other lights on, but I can't have I guess. Just a moment, Senator Marsh. Now, Senator Lundy's light came on first, Senator Marsh. But since you are up go ahead and we will take him next.

SENATOR MARSH: I wonder if this legislative body is aware that there is a Nebraska plan for reducing tobacco use
