

out there in the lobby were scrambling trying to figure what to say, and I'm sure they decided that this is the time to raise this issue and that is why it's being raised now. But, nevertheless, it has been raised. If a member of the Legislature raises a point of order that is a legitimate point, even if the ruling goes against him or her, I think that point has to be dealt with. The body could decide, remember, by a majority vote that a bill is within the call. Although I offered an amendment, during the other Special Session with reference to a repealer that had been done before, the body voted that that would not be accepted. It was ruled on on that spot. So my feeling, in order that we can have some kind of system and know where we are, is that we should try to "objectify" our consideration of this point and forget that it is dealing with this commission or the cigarette tax and look at it as one of whether or not a bill should be considered by the Legislature at all because it is or is not within the call. So since Senator DeCamp has raised that point I think the Chair should rule on that. If the Chair rules that the bill is within the call, and the Chair is going to follow the Attorney General's lead, or any reason, or just say that by a hunch the Chair feels that it is within the call, then it would behoove Senator DeCamp to try to overrule the Chair. But I'd had to see us skirt the issue. I think this is the time really to deal with it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I think so perhaps also, Senator Chambers. Your points are well taken. I'm going to rule on it from the information that I have at this time. My ruling on Senator DeCamp's point is that this bill is within the call. Now if Senator DeCamp would like to word his request from the Attorney General in another way to get another opinion, that is fine and we'll take that up when that decision is handed down. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. Chairman, or Mr. President, I do want to move to overrule the Chair and give my arguments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

SENATOR DECAMP: I am deliberately moving to overrule the Chair and it is important for future special sessions and maybe even for this one and there is a reason. Because you see if I lose, which I fully hope to, then you as a Legislature have established the principle, you have established the principle that related things not mentioned
