So my point is this is outside the call, the bill is, by the standards laid down by the Attorney General. If it is inside the call and you approve it as inside the call, you are also saying a lot of other things naturally are within the call because they are related to your overall purpose. So I move to overrule the Chair.

SPEAKER NICHOL: May I ask you a question, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You are not taking your situation...thinking of a situation so broad that you can't amend a Governor's bill, are you?

SENATOR DECAMP: Absolutely not.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The only thing you are saying...

SENATOR DECAMP: I'm thinking of the situation laid down by the Attorney General, what is in the call, what this is. I'm not saying you can't amend. I'm saying that I believe you can amend in almost any related way, and I believe the court cases say that. The Attorney General is saying that is not true except for cigarette taxes apparently, as I read his opinion.
