I am saying that if we don't take up this amendment today, and just leave the bill in its original form or with the committee amendments, would you and would others that might obstruct it agree not to obstruct? I guess I don't know how to put it any more simple.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator DeCamp, there are other Senators who are interested in this bill, and I would in all honesty have to say that in discussing Senator Beutler's amendments that he is going to offer, and I can't speak for him, that is what I have got to do. I have got to discuss the issues that come up so I can't say that I will not...I can't say that I am not going to offer the amendments and I can't say that others are not going to offer amendments. But, this is a bad bill, well, I won't discuss on your time what my philosophy is.

SENATOR DECAMP: I understand. Senator Lamb, do you have any objection to waiting until Select File before we offer this? Senator Lamb. Mr. President, I am dead serious when I say I think it is important we move the bill and that the cap limits are most important in it. With Senator Lamb's permission, unless he objects, I would ask to delay until Select File consideration, and, you see, we can put this amendment on but then you are never going to get to the bill, is my point. There are going to be a thousand other amendments, that is why.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator DeCamp, so that I can understand what you are saying, if I don't offer amendments now, then Senator Lamb, for the time being, in other words, we are going to let the bill move as it is now in where there is a million and 5 million.

SENATOR DECAMP: That is what I would like to attempt.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Has Senator Lamb agreed to that?

SENATOR DECAMP: Not yet, because I haven't got you to agree yet.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would agree to let...because you want a vote on the bill.
