

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hartnett, would you like to recess us until one-thirty, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Roll call, please. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Ladies and gentlemen, I understand we have about thirty some amendments on this bill to handle this afternoon so we should get started. But before we start I would like to introduce some special guests under the south balcony this afternoon. We have Reverend Edwin Henning and his wife Marilyn Henning from the Rosemont Alliance Church and they are here as guests today of Lottie Henderson who is our long-time postmistress in the Capitol, and, Reverend Henning and Marilyn, would you please stand and be recognized. Thank you for visiting us and, Lottie, thank you for bringing them today. Mr. Clerk, do you have the new amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Warner as Chairman of the Appropriations Committee. It would reduce the cut to the University of Nebraska from 3 percent to 2 percent.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the amendment. In terms of total dollars it amounts to 1,651,759. By campus, the University at Lincoln we have 591,000 restored; the Institute of Agriculture to have 307. UN-O would have \$227,000 and the Medical Center 472,000 approximately, all of which equals 1 percent of their
