The plain facts are, folks, you are fools and you just as well be told that now. You are foolish and foolish people do foolish things. We came here to cut the budget. We started out with a \$41 million proposal by the Appropriations Committee. We keep whittling it down and whittling it down and before you get done you are not going to be satisfied with 1 percent on income tax. You may have to have more and a little bit on the sales and maybe some services. Go back home, folks, and explain that. I'm sure that the local newspapers are going to support you vigorously. There are not enough newspapers sold, I don't suppose, Senator Lamb, in Anselmo to make much difference. It's not going to make any difference, they're not going to say anything nice about you anyway, but the point is this, that we have broken the barrier, it's the add on stage and from now on it's, Katy, bar the door. I have followed Senator Peterson, this isn't the first time. I'm going to follow him again probably, maybe not, but I think that he was right. The bee industry has got to take some responsibility for themselves and I really don't think that the world rises and sets on the bee industry in Nebraska. It's a part of it, important part of it, but it is not quite, I don't think, Senator...it reminds me a little bit, Senator Sieck, of the Ak-Sar-Ben is agriculture speech given by Senator Rod Johnson during the regular session. It stretched my imagination to the limit. Thank you very much.
