

Nebraska, key persons for the economic base in agriculture. We don't want to destroy it, so I support the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, welcome to the floor, Senator Withem. Looks like you've kind of drawn the battle lines. If you wish to have the Extension Service exterminated where you come from, maybe we can arrange that. But I would like to call to your attention, Senator Withem, that there are more students from Omaha go to Curtis than students out west go to the University of Omaha. If you'd have to make a choice, as you did, between athletics at the University of Omaha and the school at Curtis, you are dead wrong because Curtis was there, I believe, before you were ever born. This is an important issue. For you to stand up there and balance off athletics at UN-O to something that is as important as the school at Curtis, I take offense to that very, very much. But as I say, I support the resolution. We have just as much right to protect our interest as everybody else's interest is getting protected when you add money back in to the University budget, the UN-O budget and everybody else's budget, and we have no protection. So I ask you to support the resolution. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Senator Lamb, would you like to close on your motion.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, it is obvious I made a tactical error because on General File this would have flown through without any opposition to speak of. Now we have a situation where the budget cuts have been somewhat modified. A lot of people have gotten what they want. So now we have a situation where agriculture is dragging up the rear as usual, despite the rhetoric to the contrary. The Appropriations Committee does not have intent language as to where the cuts would come from, but that in itself is a bit of a contradiction because we know that ordinarily the Appropriations Committee does have intent language in its bills, and so in consideration of all these facts, and the fact that there aren't very many people here on the floor, at this point I would move to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning, Mr. Speaker.
