

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, now the question is, shall we adjourn until nine-thirty (sic) tomorrow? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Nine, nine, nine, nine. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We are not adjourned. Senator Lamb, would you like to take a vote on your motion? All right. We are now voting on the adoption of Senator Lamb's amendment. He has closed. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Chairman, are we under call?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR LAMB: Could we have everyone record their presence and then ask for a roll call, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, we can do that. Please clear the board, Mr. Clerk. Now please record your presence. We are under call, so please stay at your desk for the duration of the call. Please record your presence. Senator Beyer, Senator Landis, please record your presence. We are all here that are not excused. Now we'll have a roll call. Is that what you asked for on the advancement of the Lamb amendment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk.
