

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. You are the end of the rope. Senator Lamb, would you like to close, please. Senator Lamb, would you like to close, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Mr. President, members, we are down at that situation where it is difficult to get anything passed. But all I'm trying to do is eliminate the intent language here. When they close that position out there they are going to say the Legislature told us to do that. I don't think there are very many people in here that know whether or not that position should be eliminated. It was a recommendation from the Game and Parks to the Appropriations Committee. They accepted it in total, so now they are passing it on to us to reaffirm. None of us are really knowledgeable about that. I might explain that the people in the area are seriously concerned because there won't be a full-time person there, because of vandalism. It is a very nice park for those of you who have been there will know it is a nice park. They've always had a full-time person that lives right there on the park. So now the proposal is to just use part-time people, there will not be, as I understand it, a person on the park all the time. They'll not live there and so it will be subject to vandalism, it will be subject to the fact that there will not be somebody there that is responsive and responsible. Now all I'm saying is this body doesn't know whether that should be there or not, let the burden of that rest on the Game Commission. It is very simple. It is not increasing the budget, it is not decreasing the budget, it is saying if it should be done it should be done at the request of the Game Commission, at their command rather than at the command of the Legislature. I would ask that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Lamb amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I would ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.
