PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Morehead. The Chair recognizes Senator Remmers and then Senator Vickers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think what needs to be said has been said. I hope you were listening. I had the feeling when Senator Beutler started that there was not a whole lot of attention being paid to what he had to say. There is...I think you had better pay attention because I am sure that some employers are going to get burned on this thing and they will come back at you and say, now, hey, what happened? So they better be aware of what is happening. It is very important. I thought that Senator Beutler did a very good job of explaining the situation and I think that Senator Morehead added to that. You should...if you were listening, you probably pretty well understand what is going on. There is some difference in the approach of this amendment to what the federal guidelines wanted but I supported Senator Beutler on his attempts to avoid as much duplication as possible in our court system. So I simply urge you to read the bill. This is not just routine legislation. It is important.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I wonder if Senator Beutler would respond to some questions, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Beutler is available for answering.

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes. Senator Beutler, the committee amendments, and in order for me to understand exactly what we are voting on that, the committee amendments are not the entire reprint of the bill, I take it. Is that correct?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I...Senator Vickers, as you know, I am not the committee Chairman. I am not sure what was passed out to you. But there should be a white copy in front of you.
