

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR BARRETT: ...in the white copy?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR BARRETT: Okay. Rather than to take the Legislature's time, may I ask for a specific...may I have the section and the page.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You bet.

SENATOR BARRETT: At your convenience. Okay, thank you, Senator Beutler. As you suggested earlier, there are parts of this bill which perhaps some of us will not like but at this point I would urge the body to support the committee amendments so that we can then debate the full bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, all of my testimony was based on the original bill because I had it researched quite thoroughly and I had a lot of questions to raise but I haven't had time to have this one researched or gone through and it seems to me that it is improper in one way to hand to us this morning a complete rewrite of a bill when we haven't had time to go through it. So, therefore, I will just hold back anything I have to say until I have my researcher time to go through and find out what is going on. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I am very interested in this bill and especially to the committee amendments. Senator Beutler, are we discussing AM089S now? Okay, so we are discussing the white copy that was laid on our desk a little while ago. Okay, Senator Beutler, on page 27, I think that is Section 40, the last three lines of that section, "An employer who violates this section may be required to make full restitution to the aggrieved employee, including reinstatement and back pay." Who determines that? Is that...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Who determines that? The court determines
