

want to hear any of that because it will be irrational. Once the problem is solved, we won't hear that any more. So what I am going to do is observe the geniuses in the Legislature and outside the Legislature who are going to take this hodgepodge, blend it together and come up with a delicacy. I am using the analogy of a cake, Senator Schmit. And everybody who helps participate in the making of it should participate in the consumption and enjoyment of it. But since I am not going to be one of those who adds any ingredients, I am not going to mix it, I am not going to consume any of it and I am not going to take any responsibility for it. And by the same token, when it shows the great success in handling the child support problem, I am not going to try to take any credit either because I have no part to play in it whatsoever. I am not going to touch it. It would be pointless to try to work out any corrections in it, pointless to try to stop it and there are other fish that I have to fry this session. I am glad to deal with the income tax and that other bill that is up there that has been moving along, I may have to devote considerable time and effort to working with that. So on this very important issue, Senator Higgins, that you all are going to use to solve all the problems with this particular bill, I am going to let others handle that and that is all I have to say on it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Senator Chambers. I never knew how dynamic I was but if you say that this bill is going to solve all the problems of child support and that by my speaking and supporting this bill, I really appreciate the compliment. Nobody that I know of, no judge, no attorney and I don't think Senator Beutler or Senator Morehead or anyone on the floor this morning said this bill is going to solve all the problems of child support, no. But it is going to give us more income for the state to offset what we are now paying ADC than what we are now getting. It just stands to reason that once we are able to have more people working in the court system and hearing these child support cases. They refer to these attorneys that will be hearing nothing but child support cases as masters. We may change that name in the bill. We may call them Deputy Chizeks because I understand Senator Chizek doesn't like that name. We may call them deputy judges. We may call them associate judges but they will be
