us not to thank the Governor for short-circuiting the process of dealing with the issues that he first laid before us in Session A, and then being reconvened one day later for Session B to deal with the issue of the income tax rate increase. Now it doesn't make any difference to me how a person chooses to vote on an issue. I know how I will vote on the issue, but the point of the matter is, why shouldn't we consider all the issues at this time. Why shouldn't the Governor be able to amend the call. To amend the call simply means that you and I don't have to come peddling back down here for 7 new legislative days around Thanksgiving time. It is a simple process. I can't find anything in the Nebraska Constitution that would prohibit that process, and more importantly, I am inclined to believe that any court in the land looking at that process would say there is no harm done. The Governor is simply obviating the necessity of the third special legislative session.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, then Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR WESELY: I will be brief, Mr. Speaker, but the comments made by so many speakers would indicate that we are all upset that the Governor is calling us now and giving us a chance to deal with the income tax rate. Well, the last two weeks have been spent grousing about discussing in angered tones the fact that we are not able to deal with the income tax situation. Now the Governor has decided to change his mind and allow us the opportunity after the pressure we have exerted from this body, because the pressure has come from us, to give us a chance to deal with the income tax rates. Now that he has done that, we are turning around and attacking him. To the public out there, they have got to be wondering where we are going from down in this body and it is an amusing situation now. Some of you are consistent perhaps and others are not but it is an interesting situation because for time and again article after article, news program after news program, we have fought and argued about the fact that we have been put in a straitjacket and unable to deal with the income tax rate. I think instead of being unhappy about the situation, we ought to recognize the Governor has finally come around to recognize what I think a majority of this body has been saying for the last couple of weeks, that we are going to cut the budget but that it is not going to be enough and we are going to have to adjust the income tax rates. So instead of being upset and raising our arms and flapping
