I guess my opportunity passed, and to think that I had done that twice in that gubernatorial reign is an act of oversight on my part, but probably from my example of oversight we now have clear evidence of those who are prepared to think ahead and to learn from that that this is a good opportunity to turn the Governor's Office into their personal trampoline. I personally think that what we need to do is to look at the books that are there to tell us that this call has been by Governors of both parties amended and the Legislatures have done their business of making laws. I would suggest that that is what we should attend to this afternoon and for the rest of the session, making laws. There are those of us, perhaps, who love the prospect of making headlines or the evening news, but I think for the most part we should really stick our stubby little noses, worn down as they are by how hard we have been working, for a few more days to the grindstone and complete the business of making laws.
