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don't know. And it dealt with ADC changes that was required because of federal law changes and I assume that made some difference why that maybe it wasn't even an issue. But in any event, I would just urge the members to not react today if you think there is a procedural issue but proceed as we have been, and in a day or two if there is a legal issue that has to be met, fine, but I can't imagine that there is a problem.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pirsch for the first time.

SENATOR PIRSCH: I probably should call the question but I just want to remind you all of all the work, all the expense, all the time, and all the anguish that we have put into this session. The expense of a new session alone with new bills being introduced, printed, distributed, probably more than were in this session, every bill must have a public hearing, I just don't think that going through that can possibly be a better solution, and I urge you not to vote to adjourn sine die and we can discuss the additions to the Governor's call at more length as we get on with the business of this session.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Ladies and gentlemen, I think we could go on all afternoon on this discussion, and I don't know that it requires a ruling, but I am going to rule anyway, then if someone doesn't like it they can challenge it, but it does seem to me like we have spent a lot of time, we have done a lot work, I hate to see it all go down the drain because of a small technicality. We do have an amended proclamation and I am going to rule that we are going to continue under the amended proclamation because I feel that this body was going to address the 5 percent income tax retroactive anyway, and it seems unlikely that we should dispense with the session, go away, everything be dead, come back and run it all through the grinder again. So with that, I am going to rule that we are operating under the amended proclamation as sent over by the Governor, and continue on from this point at the place where we were this morning. Okay, Senator Carsten, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. Speaker, only for clarification. You meant 1 percent, not 5 I am sure, didn't you?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you for correcting me. I certainly did. Senator DeCamp.
