SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, maybe I should do an auction here for a \$165 turkey from Senator Scofield's district. Senator Scofield, does this the resolution just call it the Cooperative Block Building?

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 10 as offered by Senator Scofield.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. Next we go to LR 12.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 12 was also offered by Senator Scofield. It is found on page 134 of the Journal. (Read.)

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Scofield.
