

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Question, Senator Landis. I noticed that you said we could take it up Monday. I thought we were in recess Monday. Does that have anything to do then with your calculation of days? Probably not since you went down to 10 from 20.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right, Tuesday would be fine.

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you, Senator Nelson. Any further discussion on...this is an amendment, isn't it, Senator Landis? Okay. Any further discussion on the amendment on the floor? Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Question of Senator Landis.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Senator Landis, will this make any effect on the time involvement to get the cigarette stamping machines to increase the amount of money they have to pay? How will it affect the people that actually stamp them? Will it put a hardship on them with just ten days, in case it does pass with 33 votes and have the E clause and is signed right away?

SENATOR LANDIS: Right. There is a period of time, ten days, that they will have to do the work. The Revenue Department tells me that that should present no enforcement problem. With respect to the cigarette machines themselves, there are no new cigarette machines. All you do is change a numeral on the cigarette machine, which they are capable of doing I might...

SENATOR PAPPAS: Will they have to restamp the present cigarette that are already out?

SENATOR LANDIS: If there is a requirement to restamp, that requirement to restamp exists whether it is 10 or 20 days.

SENATOR PAPPAS: I was just thinking it gives more time to the people that actually do the stamping, 20 days versus 10 days.
