

there is no doubt in my mind that is what we did because I was here and I voted for it, and voted for it with that intention. We've been doing that constantly. So I think we've got to think what we're doing. If we're going to do this we better go to the regular route--sales tax, income tax, or whatever have you, but not take fees for the General Fund. That is what we're doing. I know that the...we got some cuts. The state aid has been cut three percent. Now you are cutting them another one percent because you are not supplying drivers education. To me if we want to take it away we should at least decrease the cut to three percent instead of four percent, or say two percent of state aid so they'd only get a three percent cut. But no, we passed over it so we can't even do that. We advanced LB 1 and it is impossible to do it now. But I think that was a wrong thing. You don't give us a chance. So I am asking you to take the fee out, the \$3 fee which was intended for drivers education. If that is what you want, the people out there are going to still have drivers education. I don't have any problem with that. But we are going to have to finance it ourselves. Let's take the \$3 off. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR SIECK: I'm going to ask for a roll call so I get everybody to vote. They have to show their colors. Call of the house.
