

from the license fees. It came from the General Fund. But it got put in Section 60 of the statutes rather than the sections dealing with education, just some specific language. But that broad language dealing with the same ability, as far as the teachers are concerned and as far as the programs are concerned, are already in the other sections of the statutes. The liability wouldn't change any.

SENATOR ERET: Thank you, Senator Vickers.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, did you wish to speak?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, I'm not sure now if I do or not. I've been talking to Senator Scofield and I've missed what Senator Vickers was saying. But I want to get this clear for myself. The section that we are eliminating in your amendment, "State Board of Education shall establish minimum requirements to be met for certification as a driver education instructor." Senator Vickers, under the present laws do we have a law, that if Marge Higgins wanted to go start a drivers education school, that says I have to meet certain requirements before I can do it?

SENATOR VICKERS: Well, you would have to be licensed as an instructor. But you wouldn't have to be certified as a teacher as in a public school.

SENATOR HIGGINS: No, what I'm saying is some agency of government does certify that I'm capable of teaching...

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, there are requirements to be licensed as a driving instructor, but that wouldn't be the same as a teaching certificate in the school system as a private instructor.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay. Now then...

SENATOR VICKERS: We are not changing that.

SENATOR HIGGINS: But we would be taking out driver education courses may be conducted by the school districts.

SENATOR VICKERS: And as I indicated earlier, under other broad authority and other sections of the statutes, schools have that broad authority to conduct other programs other
