We are looking for Senator Conway, Senator Harris, Senator Labedz, Senator Lamb, Senator Chambers, Senator Pappas, Senator DeCamp, Senator Lynch. Senator Vickers, did you want to accept call ins? All right. We are voting on the advancement of the bill.

CLERK: Senator Labedz voting yes. Senator Chizek voting yes. Senator Conway voting yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. The call is raised. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, LRs 10 and 12 are ready for your signature.

SPEAKER NICHOL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 10 and LR 12.
