

Legislature as well as the other items that I mentioned earlier, so I would ask the advancement of the bill at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Do you have anything to read in at this time, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do. I have an Attorney General's Opinion addressed to the Governor and a request from the Speaker that that Opinion be inserted in the Legislative Journal. (See pages 166-68 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a report from The Public Works Committee on a confirmation hearing. That is signed by Senator Schmit as Chair.

Senator Rogers has amendments to be printed to LB 10 and LB 35. (See pages 168-69 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Before we start on LR 9, may I just mention to you that of course we will not be meeting on Saturday, tomorrow, and we will not be meeting Monday, but we will be meeting Tuesday. So that you have some idea as to what we will be talking about, of course we will be talking about 35 or 10, whichever you wish to call it. That is the income tax rate. We will be discussing that. In addition to that, the taxation on cigarettes, number three. We will also be talking about LB 7 which pertains to child support collection and LB 7 which has to do with...7A, which is, of course, to appropriate funds to aid in the carrying out of provision 7, ordinarily called the A bill for number seven. I understand we do have a motion to consider some of the items on LB 1 which, of course, is the appropriation bill. So those are the things and several have been asking what we would be taking up Tuesday and those are some of the items. Incidentally, we will have the agenda out I think in about an hour or so at which time we should be nearing conclusion
