SENATOR DECAMP: I move we adjourn until Tuesday at whatever time, nine.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: We have a motion before us which is not debatable, a motion by Senator DeCamp, shall we adjourn until Tuesday at 9:00 a.m.? All those in favor vote aye, and all those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 10 nays to adjourn, Madam President.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: The motion fails. We're back on the Lamb amendment. Senator Schmit, would you care to speak, now that you're here?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think that you should all read the newspapers this morning relative to the Farm Credit System. I think you recognize, regardless of which position you're in, whether the Lamb amendment, the Beutler amendment or something else, or the DeCamp amendment, that the impact of a collapse of the Farm Credit System will go far beyond the Farm Credit System itself, far beyond the Middle West, will extend from one coast to the other, the same as most of us have been saying for a long time. I have insisted from the outset that we're not going to get much assistance of any kind from the federal government that will be of any particular assistance to the individual farmer in the Middle
