SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence promptly, please. I believe there are two excused. We've had a request for a roll call vote and in reverse order. We're looking for Senator Labeledz, Senator Landis, Senator Lynch and Senator Schmit. Okay, we may proceed with the roll call in reverse order. The question is the advancement of the bill.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, appears on page 178 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Do you have anything you want to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 35 and recommend that same be placed on Select File.
