SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, I said I think it is inside. What do you think?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Tell me what we're talking about, John.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. It's an amendment that would allow, when the Legislature is not in session and changed circumstances occur as a result of new statistical data or changes in the economy, that instead of coming into session the Board of Equalization would have the mandatory duty to make such adjustments as are necessary to maintain the projected cash flow, in other words create an emergency thing.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Offhand I would say that would be outside the call. Does that surprise you?

SENATOR DECAMP: Now you are wrong, but then what the heck. Okay. Fine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you wish to withdraw that motion, or...

SENATOR DECAMP: I'm not going to appeal the ruling of the Chair.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, thank you. It is withdrawn. Do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?
