

SENATOR SCHMIT: Is it probable?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Senator Johnson, question. We have three programs here. Maybe it would be helpful for you to identify particularly where we are adding the most money, Program 102, the \$269,689.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I believe that is in the audit area, audit and field service.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, that would be the audit and field service, those people that would go out into the field.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Could you tell me then what Program 105, for the \$41,000, almost \$42,000...

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I think that is travel, in other words they've got...

SENATOR PIRSCH: That is travel expenses for those auditors?
