SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise to oppose the motion of Senator Beutler. I had my light on before we voted before and wanted to make the point that Senator Warner just made, that there is flexibility in these departments. And even though it was pointed out, those areas that would be cut, I don't know nor do you know that those in reality are going to actually happen in total. I believe that that department is large enough, flexible enough and capable enough to float their dollars to do the best good for the state and for their department. But besides that, Mr. President, it seems to me that it is indeed improper for us to reconsider a vote that we have just taken when we have just had a call of the house for the vote. And whether we had a call of the house or whether we didn't, we are here to do a job. I understand that there are times when each of us is called from the floor that is necessary, but in many instances we could be here and vote when we needed to vote whether we wanted to or not. I think to ask for a reconsideration motion right now is certainly about as improper and not in good taste as I've ever seen. I hope that you turn this motion down. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye. Record, Mr. Clerk.
