

Johnson, would you be prepared to go without Senator Wesely, or do you care to wait?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Very well. Senator Wesely has arrived. We can proceed with the roll call vote, Mr. Clerk. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 189 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The motion passes. We will be reconsidering Senator Johnson's motion. Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: The arguments have been made. I would move the amendment.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The call is raised. It is debatable. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, a couple of points of information, if we amend the bill then, assuming it is a pretty big budget bill, when would it get back before the Legislature reasonably, at the earliest?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: As I understand it, Senator DeCamp, conceivably the bill could be brought back from the drafter's today, and without a suspension the earliest we could read would be Friday.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, that would be if the entire bill got processed and returned to the Legislature today?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: That's correct.
