

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, and is that reasonable to expect, or not, does anybody know?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: It is conceivable are the words that were led to me.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. Mr. President, I would argue against adopting the amendment. I think we pretty well decided the format of the budget bill. If you take \$300,000 here I rather suspect the next thing will be substantially more than that in the state aid area. Then you are back to some of the same old problems. I think it reasonable to say then we should probably consider instead of going down to two percent, for the University and state colleges, going back to three percent for everybody which may be the more reasonable solution in light of these events. But in any case, I still suggest that you do not go ahead and put this amendment on. I realize there were a couple of switches, one way or the other, last time. But one more switch against voting for the amendment or putting it on might be the prudent course.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'd yield to Senator Lundy.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President and colleagues, I would simply rise to probably repeat some things that have been spoken here on this floor relative to the question before us, the question of considering and reconsidering some points that have been made relative to the Department of Revenue. I think Senator Warner has quoted figures to you indicating that the total budget for the department is something like nine to nine and a half million dollars. I would suggest to you that the Department of Revenue can do as other departments in state government find themselves doing, for instance the Liquor Control Department, where it is necessary to throw inspectors into a certain area to check on inventories, to check on sales to minors, to check on drunken driving cases, and these kind of cases are not unheard of, they are done regularly, I would suggest to you that this would be no different in using selective enforcement as is done in some of the cities in our state. It is done by the Highway Patrol continuously where they are
