

SENATOR HABERMAN: I am asking, is this amendment going to be offered? Because I don't know which...I have been researching amendments and I don't know which amendment I have been researching and I should be researching.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Clerk, would you advise Senator Haberman which amendment we are on?

CLERK: Senator, we are on amendment, it is number 95S. It is on page 157 of your Journal. Okay?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Does that answer your question? Okay. Senator Hoagland, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We have reviewed Senator Lynch's amendment over in the Judiciary Committee staff, Mr. Speaker, and have no objection to it. Indeed, I think it would help clarify the definition of spousal support and would urge this body to adopt it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, there are no other lights. Senator Lynch, would you like to close?

SENATOR LYNCH: I think enough has been said, Mr. Chairman. I would ask for a vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? We are voting on the adoption of the Lynch amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Lynch's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Lynch amendment is adopted. What do you have next, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lynch would move to amend. Senator this is your amendment number 108S.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch, please. 108S.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and member, I would move to withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, it is withdrawn.
