

CLERK: 28 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator Hoagland, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask the adoption of the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hoagland's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone LB 7.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you want to take that up tonight?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Hoagland got up and made a long dissertation speech about how many months were spent on this bill. They worked for all these different entities and all the work that went into the bill and I really won't doubt that but I will bring this to your attention. This bill came out of the committee on November the 6th. This bill has been before the body for three days, three days. Now I will not argue that we have to pass the bill but my point is do we have to pass this particular detailed misunderstandable, not understandable, bill. Now I made a mistake and I said we will take these things up on Select File. Well, it is on Select File I find out and it is going to go to Final Reading. So this is my error and I should have been awake when it was on Select File. So rather than to lay the bill over, I wanted to make this little pitch to show you that it has only been here three days, not months and months and months, and that on Final Reading, I hope we have enough time to have our staff
