

there are a lot of solutions that are being enacted by this particular bill. Finally I would like to point out that I don't feel we really had to deal with this particular topic in the special session. LB 600 was sitting on Final Reading. I don't know the Governor felt in his wisdom that we should discuss this particular issue in the special session. I would have been more comfortable enacting let's say 90 percent of the bill or the garnishment, the liens in this particular special session, if we are going to do it, and then deal with the particular topic that Senator Haberman discussed dealing with the court systems, because I feel that that 10 percent of the bill really isn't all that significant. We could have time to study it for a couple of months, a couple of more months, and then enact it in LB 600, and maybe that is something Senator Haberman will think about stripping out of the bill on Final Reading. Finally I would like to point out one, I guess it is one reason to enact that bill and that has been money. I know when LB 600 came up, both in committee as well as on the floor, we were told that we would lose approximately \$4.5 million or \$5 million if we didn't enact this bill. Well, that sum has considerably been reduced. I believe Senator Hoagland talked about \$100,000 that we could possibly lose if we don't enact this piece of legislation in the special session and I think that we are not really getting the straight story on it. I don't feel that to my recollection and in my discussions with other people I can't recall an instance where the federal government has taken away that money if we have shown a good faith effort to try to pass legislation to deal with a particular problem.

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR ABEOD: And I feel that this is just a paper tiger on the part of the federal government and they are forcing us to enact legislation which I think could require a little bit more study. But this particular amendment that Senator Beutler is attempting to strip out of the bill is a good example of it is a good idea, they would like everybody to pay child support payments, but it really needs to be fine tuned. And maybe the Congress in the future, let's hope at least, that they will take a little bit more time when they enact this type of legislation and give us legislation that we can deal with.
