CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 208 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 7 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 6 passes with the emergency clause attached. Move on to LB 14.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to return LB 14 to Select File for specific amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DEKAMP: Mr. President, the sole purpose of this is to read something into the record on intent. I don't think it is a problem, in fact, I am sure it is no problem. However, the question was raised about whether the 5 million cap applies to cases filed after the passage of the bill or occurrences of events after the bill. Well, obviously, it applies to occurrences. I don't think there is any question but I just want to make that clear for the record. As in any legislation of this type, you are talking about the occurrences rather than when people filed the cases so I just want to make that clear. And as I say, I think there is no confusion but as would be the case on any legislation of this type you are talking about occurrence rather than case filings.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you withdraw your motion? All right. Do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Read the bill please.

CLERK: (Read LB 14 on Final Reading.)
