

SENATOR SCOFIELD: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1 pass with the emergency clause attached? 33 votes are required. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 211 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 4 nays, 2 present and not voting.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: LB 1 passes with the emergency clause attached. The Chair recognizes Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: For what reason are you recognizing me?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: It is my understanding you have an announcement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We will move on to #7, is it, LB 7, so just proceed.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on LB 7. Senator Hoagland would move to return the bill for a specific amendment.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: For what reason do you rise, Senator Hartnett?

SENATOR HARTNETT: I would like to, whatever, a point of personal privilege. I would like to have the Pages pass out some cookies that I got from my home district, from the person in charge of the food service at Bellevue Public Schools. When I served many years on the school board, we used to sometimes have luncheon meetings when we were dealing with salary negotiations, so one time I complained about not having anything for dessert so the cook made me a very large cookie.
