

Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned, Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would move the adoption of the amendment at this time, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, and those hardy souls who are still here, I have a question to ask. Senator Hoagland, so that I am clear first of all, this delays, if it is adopted, until July 1st of 1986 taking over of this operation by the Attorney General? Senator Hoagland answered that is correct because his mike wasn't on. Now, Senator Hoagland, why cannot you just delete all of this reference to the Attorney General and deal with it in the January session? That is my question.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: All right, it is because the Legislature made a decision yesterday that the Attorney General should be more involved in the enforcement functions, Senator Chambers, that we would have a better bill if that were done.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if the Attorney General does not become involved until July of next year and we will have had a complete session and be adjourned by July of next year, why cannot that whole proposition be just taken out and dealt with during the session of 1986?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, if it makes sense to do it, we should do it now so the Department of Social Services and the Attorney General's Office will have eight months, seven months or eight months to plan the transition.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then why delay it until July 1st, because of three jobs, you said?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, three to nine jobs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, thank you. Members of the
