CLERK: 6 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return and record your presence. Did you want to take in call in votes, Senator Wesely? Okay.

CLERK: Senator Withem voting yes. Senator Harris voting yes. Senator Beyer voting yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. May I introduce a guest, please, of Senator Lowell Johnson. Under the north balcony, Mr. Robert Luckhart of Costa Mesa, California.
