SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President and members of the body, it is obvious that Senator Wesely and I can't quote scripture like Senator Chambers but Senator Wesely just said turn the other cheek and I guess I will say, "Do unto others" and like Senator Wesely just said, we probably will thank Senator Chambers too when he retires. Sam Segnar is a fine man and so is Willis Strauss and we probably don't have any business, like Senator Chambers said, getting in the middle of this. I don't think that whether we thank a person or don't thank a person has anything to do with how much that person makes in dollars and I don't think we should judge our thanks on that basis. I have seen both of these men, as all of you have, contribute to their community of Omaha and to the state in their way and they are in business, that's right. But if this total body as a Legislature wants to make a statement and they sign that resolution and they feel that the participation that these individuals have given and will probably thank Willis Strauss when and if he retires, then I think that is our prerogative, not based on any innerworkings of Internorth as a company or any salaries that either one of these men make. They have been I think and still continue to be a very definite part of the economic community of this state and so for this reason I would support our saying thank you.
