But if the Legislature as a whole decides to do it, I want it crystal clear that I was not a party to it. And remember, if you insist on keeping the resolution, even with the amendments that I succeeded in obtaining, the one amendment which was to strike the word "Inexpensive", you have that offending thank you to that person which under the circumstances can only be construed as an insult. And if you don't strike this provision, you have a contradictory position of praising the individuals who kicked him out of his position. Lay and Strauss are the other team and they won, they won.
