SENATOR CARSTEN: Call of the house has been asked for. All those in favor of a call of the house will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Has everybody voted? So record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 7 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: We are under call. Will you please return to the Chamber and register your presence. All those that are outside the Chamber, will you please come and register your presence, please. Senator Landis, Senator Withem. Okay, we may proceed and, as Senator Chambers says, the Clerk will call the roll. All those in favor of the amendment will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 224 of the Legislative Journal.) 6 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The amendment loses. Do you have anything further on the resolution?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do have a motion from Senator Miller to suspend the rules and vote on LR 20.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Miller. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like to know what rules the motion says are to be suspended.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Miller, can you give us some enlightenment on what rule you are suspending?

SENATOR MILLER: A rule that would allow us to vote on this resolution.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Chambers.
